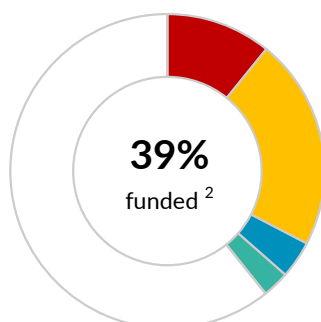

Methodology: Unearmarked funding is allocated and reallocated multiple times during the year to allow UNHCR to fund prioritised activities. This funding update includes an indicative allocation of funds so as to accurately represent the resources available for the sub-region. The contributions earmarked for Philippines shown above are combined with an indicative allocation of the softly earmarked and unearmarked contributions listed below. This allocation respects different levels of earmarking. Adjustments relate to programme support costs and carry-over.

Notes:

1. The financial requirements for South East Asia are for the operations in Bangladesh, Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Thailand and Thailand Regional Office.
2. The percentage funded (39%) and total funding amount (\$158,441,878) are indicative based on the methodology described above. This leaves an indicative funding gap of \$245,244,476 representing 61% of the financial requirements.
3. Contributions to South East Asia are shown by the earmarking modality as defined in the Grand Bargain.
4. Due to their earmarking at the region, or to a related situation or theme, the other softly earmarked contributions listed are those which can potentially be used in South East Asia. Where a donor has contributed \$2 million or more, the total amount of the contributions is shown.
5. Contributed without restrictions on its use, unearmarked funding allows UNHCR critical flexibility in how best to reach refugees and other populations of concern who are in the greatest need and at the greatest risk. Where a donor has contribution \$10 million or more, the total amount of the contribution is shown.
