COMMUNITY MAPPING

- As of 2nd October, 68 communities were identified and mapped at family level (estimated 85,000 refugees)

SHELTER/NFIs

- More than 10,000 plastic sheets distributed
- Over 3,000 non-food items kits** distributed
- Total of 449 tents installed

WASH

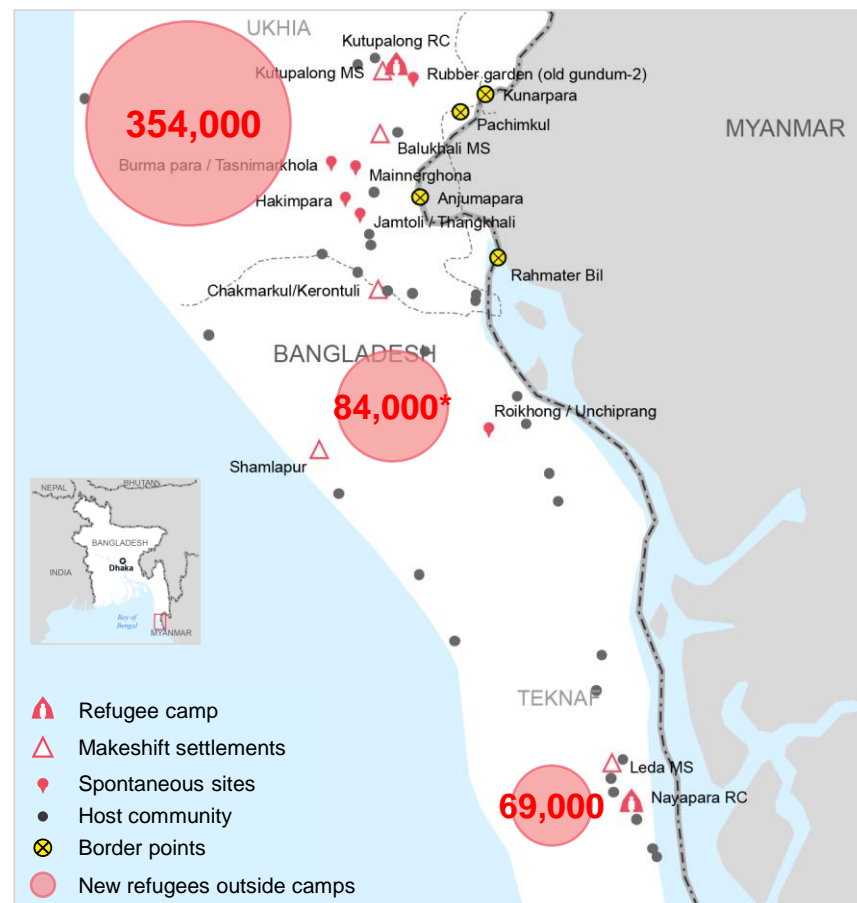
- Over 12,500 refugees have access to latrines
- Over 16,000 have access to tube wells
- 50% covered of the USD 4 million required improve road access to shelters

HEALTH

- More than 20,000 consultations provided
- Average of 445 consultations provided daily
- Over 10,000 vaccines provided

FOOD & NUTRITION

- Over 8,800 refugees a day receive food through the community kitchen
- Over 1,800 children admitted for malnutrition treatment
- Over 2,000 pregnant and lactating women admitted for supplementing



Since 25 August 2017, an estimated half a million refugees have crossed into Bangladesh. They settled in the existing camps and nearby makeshift settlements as well as in surroundings areas, where there is no infrastructure.
