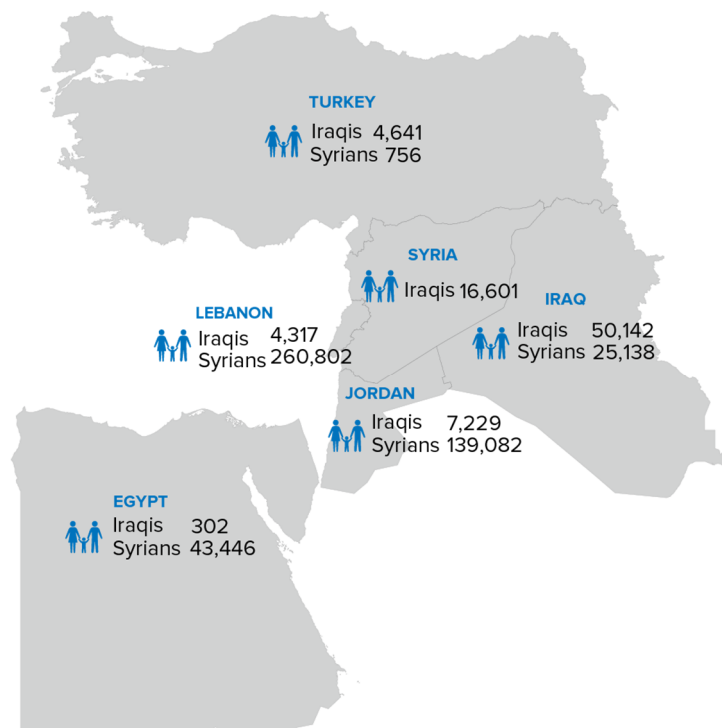

UNHCR is grateful to the donors who have contributed to the cash assistance programme for the Syrian and Iraqi IDPs and refugees with un-earmarked and broadly earmarked funds as well as those who have contributed directly to the operations.

Additional funds are urgently required to respond to the critical needs of beneficiaries.

Without additional funding:

- 60,000 Syrian refugee families will be cut from monthly cash assistance in Lebanon and Jordan from November onwards and 1,875 Syrian refugee families in Iraq will not receive cash assistance leaving the refugee families at risk of not being able to make ends meet.
- 6,600 vulnerable IDP returnees in Iraq will not receive cash assistance which is critical to help them rebuild their homes and manage basic necessities such as food and utilities.
- 6,600 Iraqi refugee children in Syria will not be supported with cash assistance to help cover education costs.
