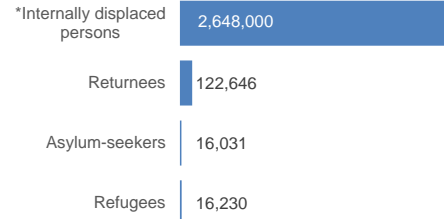

In October, 71,000 new displacements were monitored by the UNHCR-led PRMN, a slight increase compared to last months. Half of the internally displaced came to Banadir from Lower Shabelle due to conflict. In 2018 so far, PRMN has monitored 831,000 internal displacements due to conflicts, floods and drought. As of 31 August, there are estimated to be 2.6 million internally displaced people in Somalia.

As of October 2018, UNHCR registered 32,261 refugees and asylum seekers in Somalia. Most people seeking asylum in Somalia are from Ethiopia and Yemen.

Somali refugees continue to return from countries of asylum. Statistics from UNHCR indicate that over 122,000 people have voluntarily returned from twelve countries of asylum since 2014. The countries include Kenya, Yemen, Djibouti, Libya, Tunisia and Eritrea.

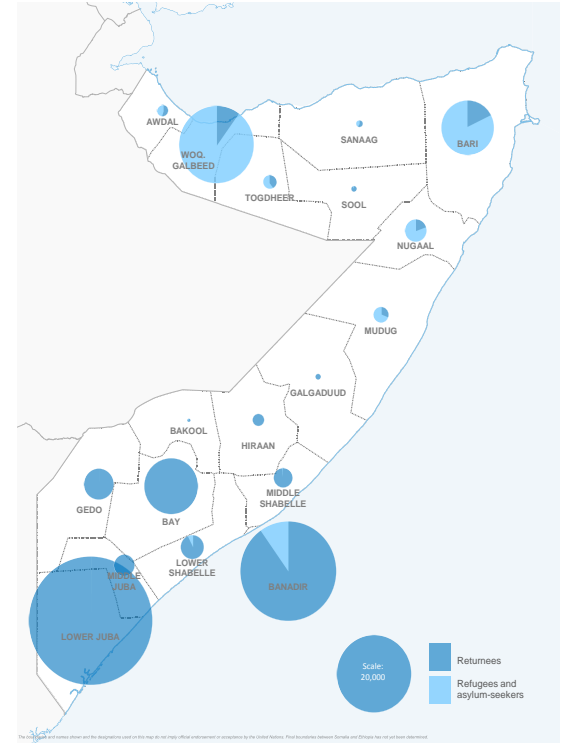
As of the report date, there are 32,261 refugees & asylum-seekers registered in Somalia, mainly from Ethiopia (15,757 asylum seekers and 3,858 refugees) and Yemen (54 asylum seekers and 12,071 refugees). In addition, 521 persons are from other countries including Syria (210), Tanzania (103), Eritrea (90).

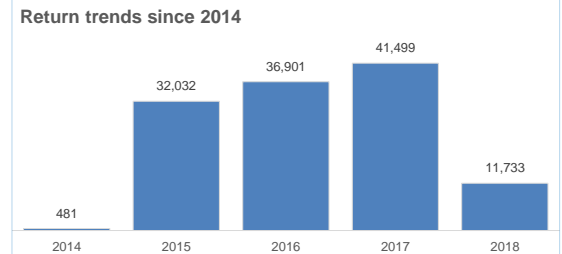
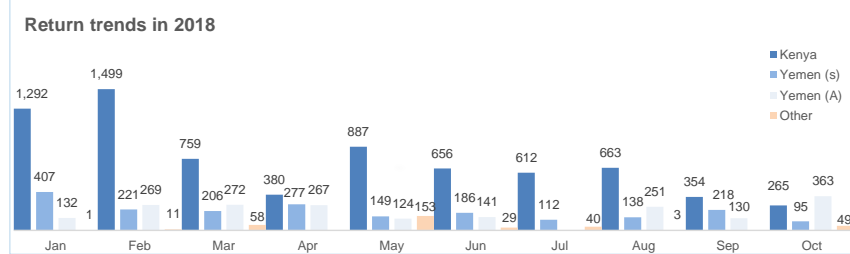
refugee returnees (2014 - 2018)

In total 122,646 Somali refugees have voluntarily returned to Somalia since December 2014. Of those, UNHCR has provided assistance to 82,664 returnees from Kenya and 2,763 returnees from Yemen (under ASR programme) and 1,034 returnees from other countries. Approximately 36,185 spontaneous returnees from Yemen have been received.

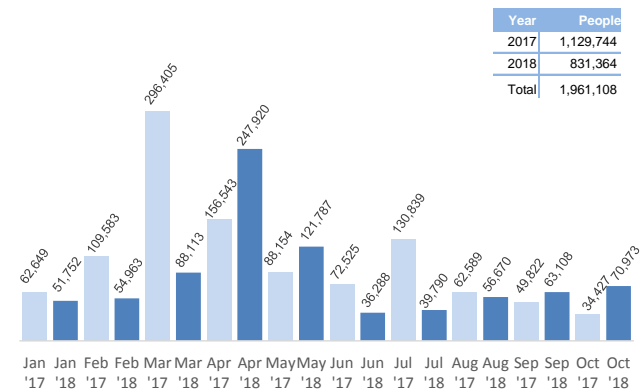

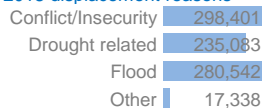

Displacements Monitored by UNHCR Protection and Return Monitoring Network (PRMN)

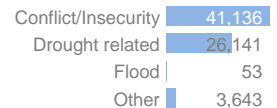
Monthly internal displacement (2017-2018)



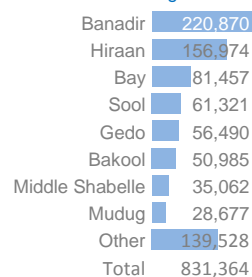
2018 displacement reasons



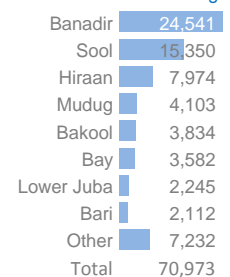
October 2018 displacement reasons

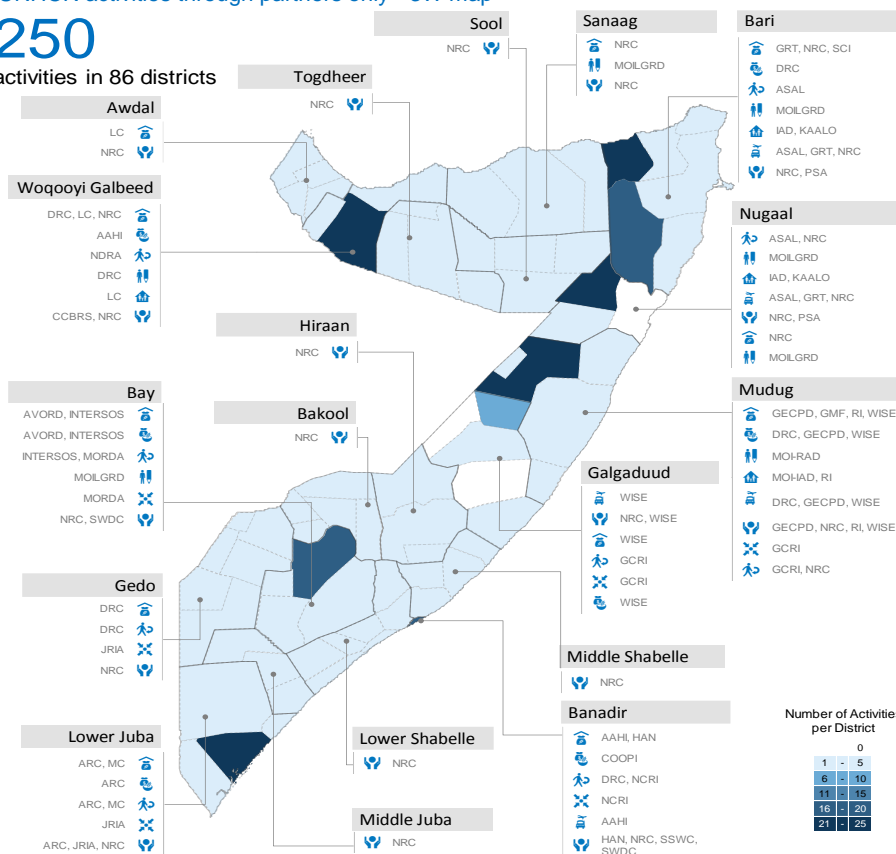

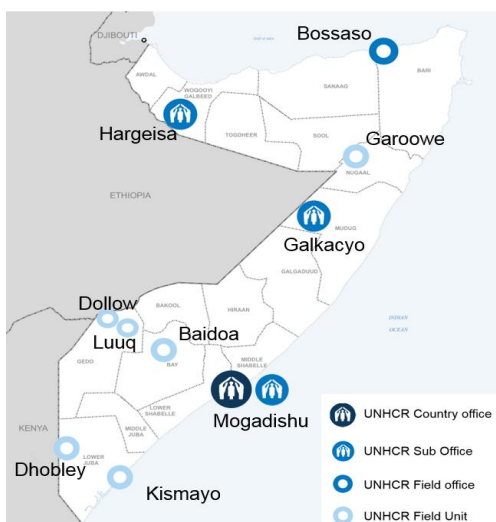

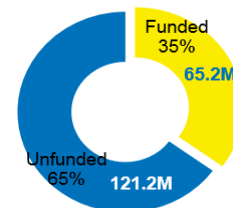
