Notes:

The figures in this report are indicative allocations at the time of its production and are subject to change month by month. Flexible funds are allocated and re-allocated multiple times to different operations throughout the year, depending on the funding status of the operation and earmarked contributions received by that operation. This movement of income is invaluable as it allows UNHCR to kick-start, bolster or enable operations to implement their programmes as fully as possible, according to need and without interruption in vital assistance.

Regional totals include allocations to UNHCR country operations, multi-country offices, and regional bureaux. Under UNHCR's decentralized structure, the bureaux are situated in forward locations and contain strong capacities for protection and operational support, strategic planning and resource management, monitoring, internal control, risk management, and external engagement.

Global Programmes are a suite of centrally-managed activities that cut across geographical lines, helping UNHCR deliver more efficiently and effectively. They include work to drive policy priorities such as UNHCR's championing of global solidarity and responsibility sharing, climate action, addressing statelessness and internal displacement, accountability, data and digitalization. Global programmes also include technical advice and management of cash assistance, education, resettlement, and registration programmes, ensuring continuity in stockpiles, and programmes to strengthen self-reliance and inclusion. Global programmes also help UNHCR to multiply its resources and its reach, including investments in mobilizing contributions from the private sector.
