





COVID-19 cases as % of population






COVID-19 vaccinations as % of population*

HIGHLIGHTS

- The number of cases among refugees remains well below the national average, with 3% of the refugee camp population having tested positive since the onset of the pandemic, compared to 7% of the total population in Jordan.
- The recovery rate of 98% among refugees in camps reflects the national recovery rate.
- Close to 57% of the refugee camp population eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine have registered on the government platform.
- ◆ Over 19,500 refugees, representing almost 40% of the eligible camp population, have received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine, compared to 8% of the total population in Jordan.
- Refugees living in urban areas of Jordan are also included in the national COVID-19 vaccination plan.
- In May, vaccination numbers among refugee populations in camps more than tripled, as a result of the 10-day campaign launched by the Emirati Red Cross to vaccinate Syrian refugees in camps in Jordan. More than 10,000 refugees were vaccinated as part of the campaign.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

- ◆ Two in-camp vaccination centres in Zaatari and one in Azrag camp
- <u>Awareness raising</u> about the COVID-19 vaccination program, through focus group discussions, the UNHCR Helpline, <u>outreach</u> volunteers, FAQs, social media, and more
- Upgrading of quarantine facilities in camps
- Health screening <u>procedures</u>, surveillance and monitoring

- ◆ PPE provision for frontline workers/refugees
- ◆ <u>Remote services</u>, **protection hotlines** and newly launched <u>Help</u> <u>website</u> platform
- Supporting refugee access to <u>e-learning</u> platforms
- Enhanced **community engagement** and **communications** via SMS text, social media and WhatsApp to refugee populations
