

Somalia

1 - 31 August 2021

In August, 36,000 new internal displacements were monitored by the UNHCR-led Protection and Returns Monitoring Network (PRMN). Drivers include conflict and insecurity (24,000), drought (8,000) and flood (2,000) related, and more than 1,000 displaced due to other triggers.

Galgaduud (13,000) received the highest number of displaced persons, while Bay (5,000), and Mudug (3,000) and regions also received relatively high numbers.

Refugees & Asylum-Seekers

At the end of August 2021, there were 27,184 refugees and asylum-seekers registered in Somalia, mainly from Ethiopia (14,293 asylum seekers and 4,236 refugees) and Yemen (7,474 refugees). The remaining 1,181 persons were from other countries including Syria (906), Tanzania (135) and others (140).

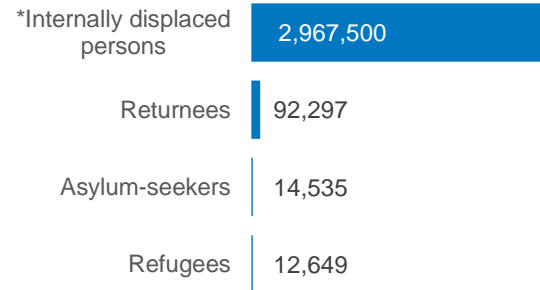

Refugee Returnees (2014 - 2021)

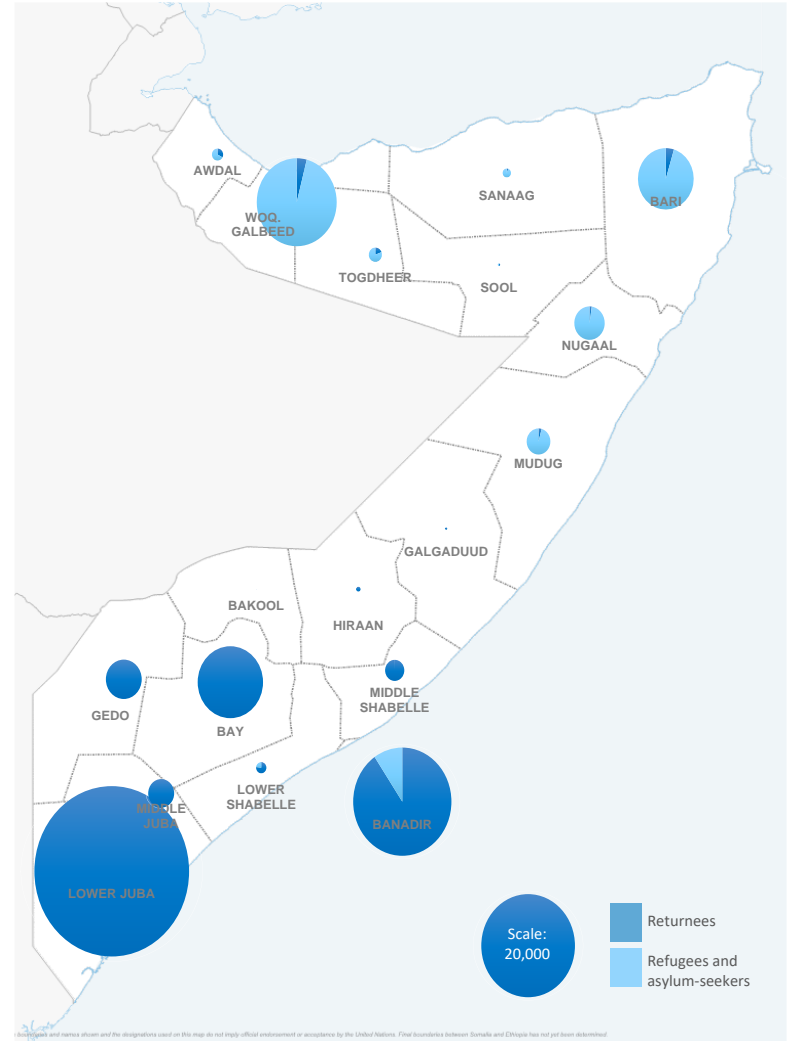
Since December 2014, 92,297 Somali refugees have voluntarily returned to Somalia with UNHCR assistance from different countries of asylum including Kenya, Yemen, Djibouti, Libya, Sudan and Eritrea. In addition, some 40,689 Somalis were monitored as arriving from Yemen since March 2015.

*Estimated internally displaced persons as of November 2020 (Source: Information Management Working Group)

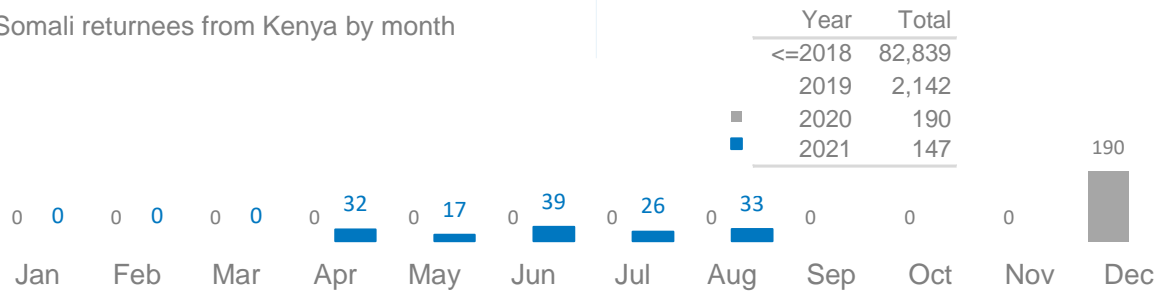

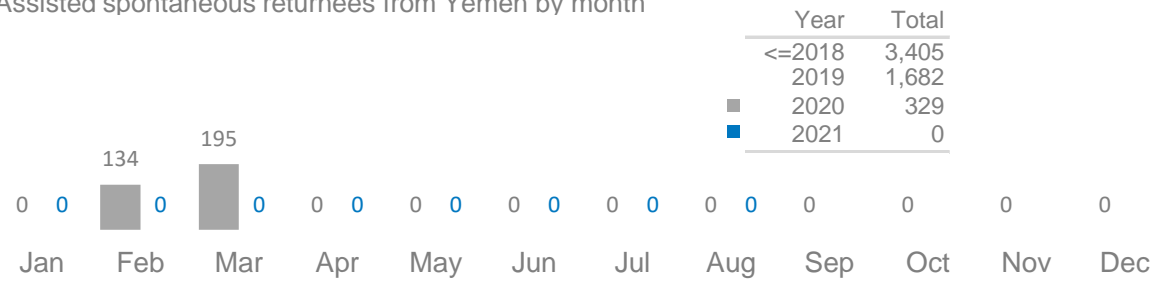

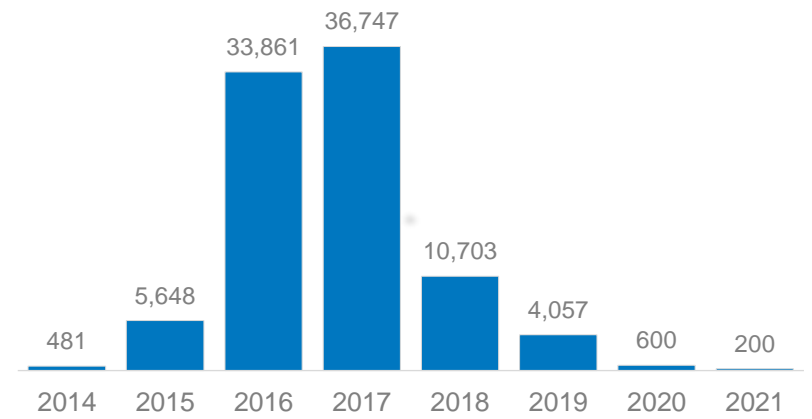
Somali returnees from Kenya by month

Number of returnees (with assistance from UNHCR) since 2014

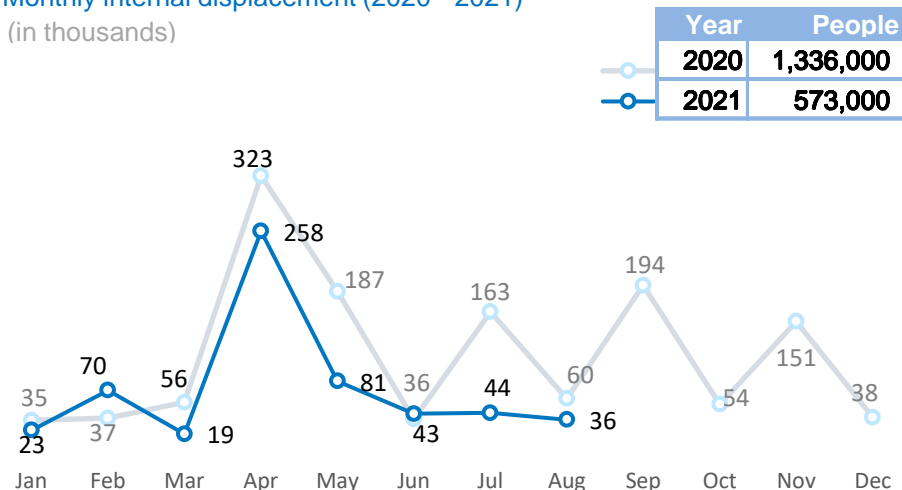

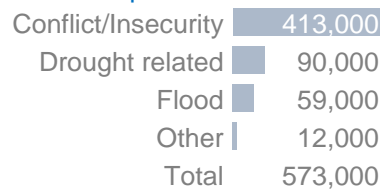

Monthly internal displacement (2020 - 2021)

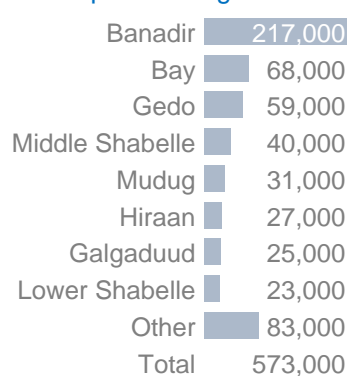

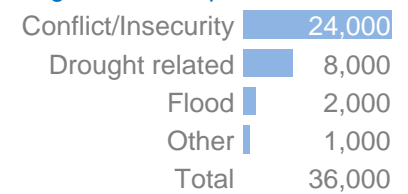
2021 displacement reasons



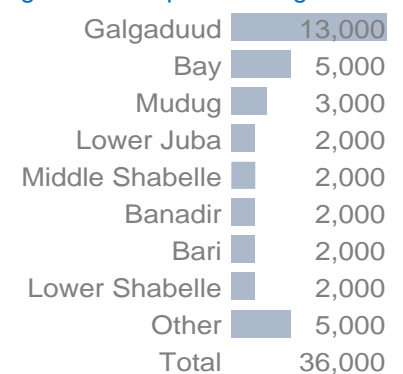
2021 top arrival regions



August 2021 displacement reasons

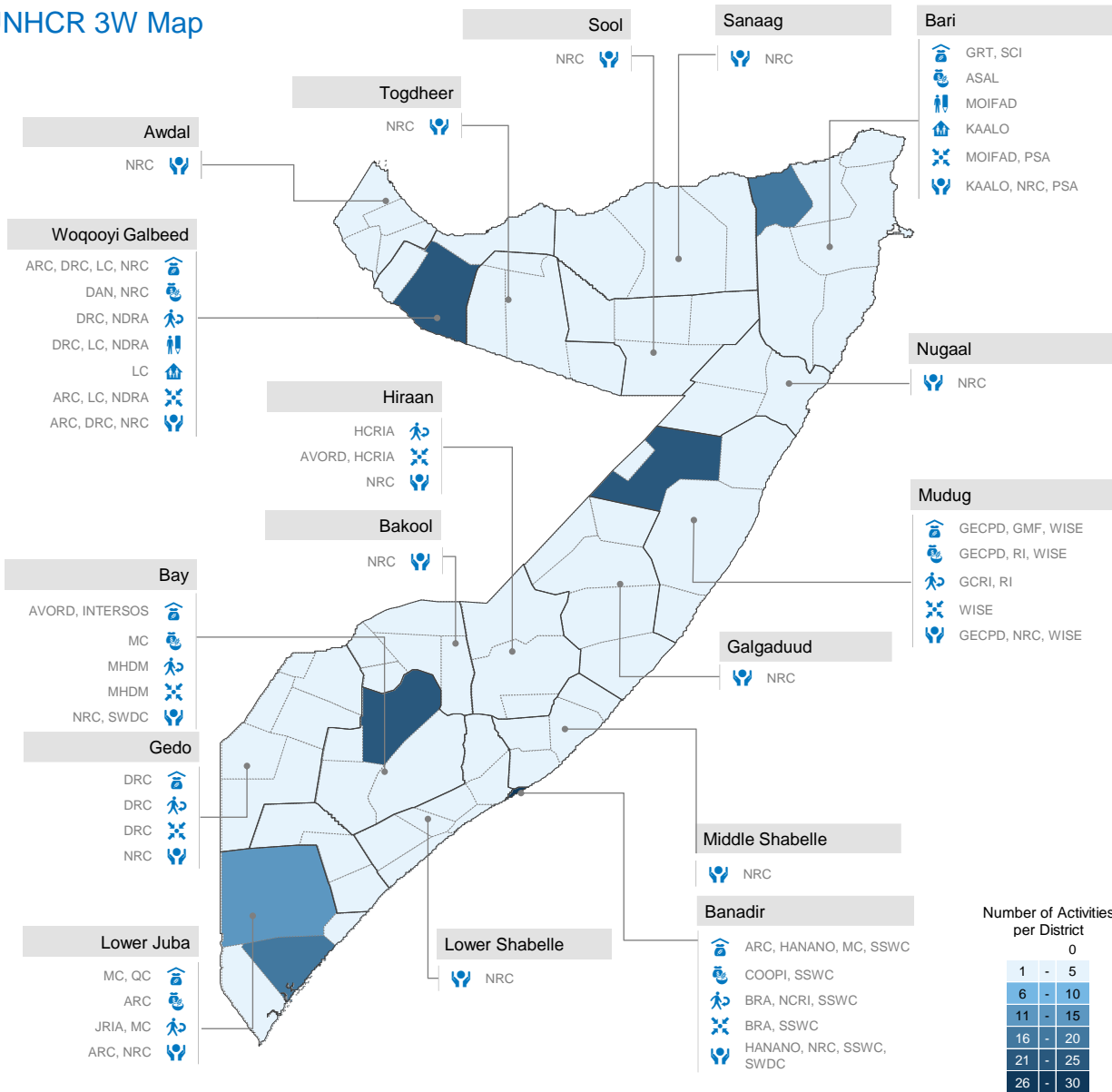

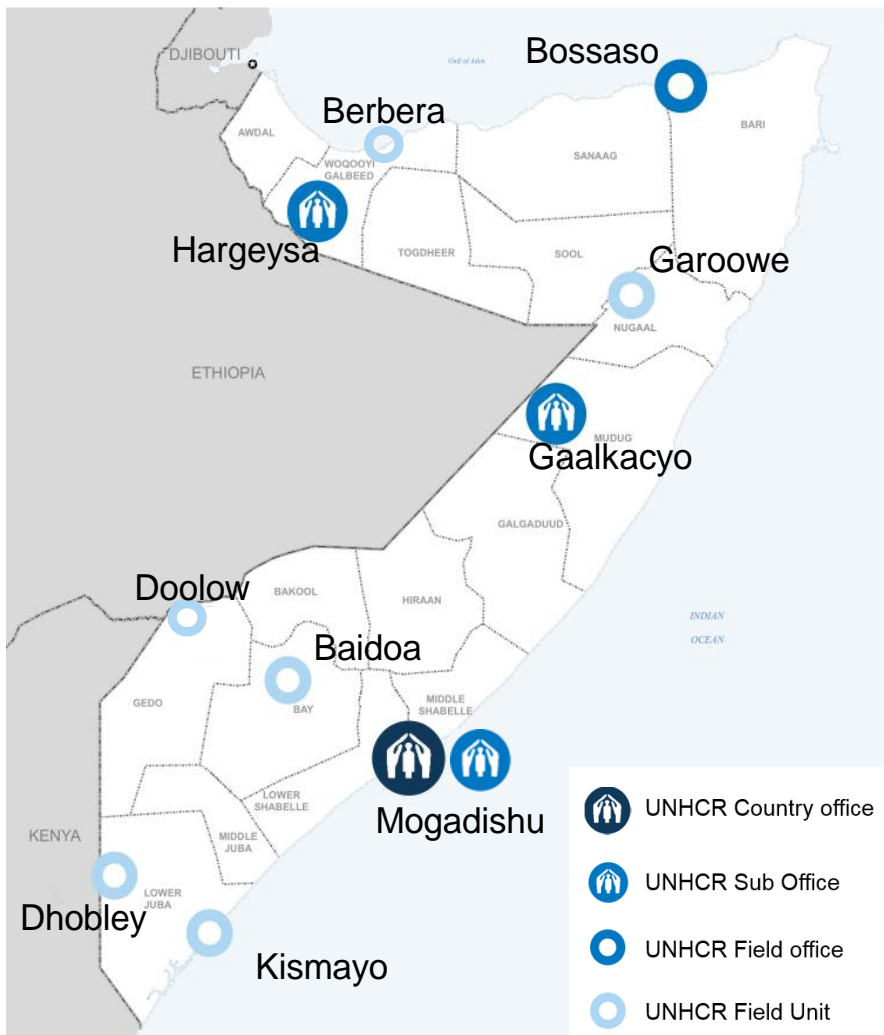

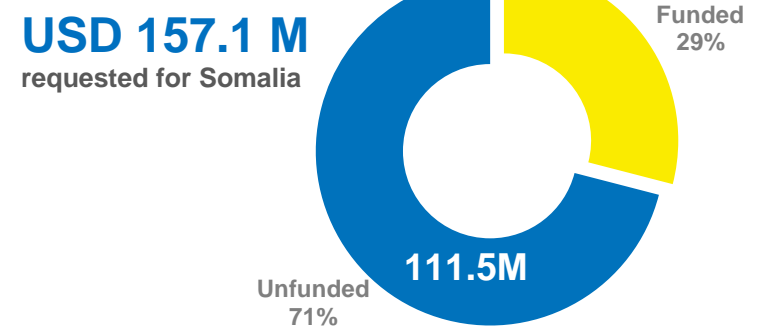
