

#### 1.421 (765 SYR, 656 Non-SYR) calls received. Breakdown of calls by theme: 29% are SGBV/LGBTI Hotlines 71% are non-CP/SGBV 35% are related to Cash/Basic needs, 27% are related to RST/RSD 7% are related to registration and 3% are related to health Petitions 91 (57 SYR, 34 Non-SYR). Emails received from PoCs requesting follow up, assistance and other interventions were processed during the reporting period 484 (291 SYR, 193 Non-SYR) children referred to Follow up **GBV** unit for services and follow up: 23 referrals from partners, and **461** from UNHCR other units rals & 857 (465 SYR, 392 Non-SYR) children referred from GBV unit for services and follow up; 224 referrals made to partners, and 633 to UNHCR other Ref units WOMEN EMPOWERMENT 708 Women trained in Self-Defense classes

	Enhance SGBV interventions through co-leadership of SGBV Sub-working group	<ul> <li>Improve quality of SGBV interventions through dissemination of global standards and provision of capacity building activities</li> <li>Conduct SGBV safe referrals training of trainers (ToT) targeting UN agencies, thus ensuring compliance with survivor-centred approach</li> <li>Mainstreaming SGBV referral pathways through mobile application, which enables frontline workers to refer survivors to specialized SGBV services and refugees to have access to information on available services</li> <li>Produce mid-year and annual analytical reports on SGBV trends, highlight gaps</li> <li>Advocate with donors to address funding gaps in SGBV sector</li> <li>Mapping livelihood services and finding creative approaches to cover the gap.</li> </ul>
	Strengthen national system	<ul> <li>Support to Ministry of Social Development for the provision of safe shelter to SGBV survivors</li> <li>Support to Family Protection Department to improve access to justice for SGBV survivors</li> <li>Support to National Council for Family Affairs (NCFA) for dissemination of national SoPs on family protection</li> </ul>
	Ensure provision of quality SGBV prevention and response services	<ul> <li>Expand women empowerment programming (workshops, refugee-led self defense classes, etc.) through local NGO's</li> <li>Expand support to local NGO's for the provision of psycho-social support through case management approach for SGBV survivors, along with continuous coaching to ensure compliance with minimum standards</li> <li>Establish a SGBV coaching program for UNHCR staff thus contributing to improve quality of support provided to survivors (SGBV case management coaching for specialized staff, safe referrals/SGBV prevention and response trainings for general staff)</li> <li>strengthen efforts to provide training and awareness-raising on LGBTI issues.</li> </ul>
