

## Population movement

As of 18 February, 2,232 refugees and migrants have been registered as rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard and disembarked in Libya. On 12 February, some 90 individuals arrived at the Tripoli Naval Base. UNHCR and its medical partner, the International Rescue Committee (IRC), were present at the disembarkation point to provide urgent medical assistance and core relief items before individuals were transferred to detention centres by the Libyan authorities.

## UNHCR response

On 14 February, UNHCR in coordination with IOM and IRC distributed CRIs at Al-Mabani detention centre in Tripoli. The distribution targeted some 980 refugees and migrants where assistance including blankets, hygiene kits and winter clothes was provided. Since January 2020, UNHCR has provided CRIs to some 18,800 refugees and asylum-seekers both living in the urban community and held in detention centres in Libya.

Last week, UNHCR registered a total of 239 individuals at the Serraj Registration Office, Tripoli. Newly registered individuals included nationals from Sudan (114), Syria (99), Palestine (16), Eritrea (6), Ethiopia (2) and Somalia (2). Those newly registered were provided with UNHCR certificates. The office also processed a total of 515 individuals including 67 individuals with refugee-status determination and resettlement appointments. So far in 2021, UNHCR has registered 943 refugees and asylum-seekers in Libya.

UNHCR's hotlines continue to respond to the enquires of its persons of concern. Last week, a total of 132 calls were received through the registration and Benghazi hotlines. Information on durable solutions, registration, medical and cash assistance was provided.

UNHCR's winter assistance programme continues, providing help for some of the most vulnerable internally displaced persons (IDPs) in Libya. Last week, partner LibAid distributed assistance to some 2,500 IDPs in Al-Zawiya (45 km west of Tripoli) and Al-Qala'a in the Nafusa mountains. This included blankets, solar lamps, hygiene kits, winter clothes, socks, gloves and plastic sheets. As of 18 February, some 13,000 IDPs (2,400 households) have received winter assistance.

Provision of medical assistance is crucial for refugees and asylum-seekers in Libya. Since the beginning of the year, UNHCR through its medical partner, has IRC provided 1,626 primary healthcare consultations including 1,397 in the urban community, 173 at the disembarkation points and 56 in detention centres.
